#### Rector's Letter



As I write this, it is clear to see that spring has arrived; new life is beginning to appear wherever you look. Seeds that have been resting beneath the soil through the dark winter have begun to feel the embrace of the warm sun penetrating the earth, bringing life and transforming them so that over the coming year they may bear fruit. In the darkness of winter, it's not unknown for us to make a New Year's resolution: we plant the seed of our intentions of how we would like to see our lives transformed over the coming year. Like gardening, we have to work at preparing the soil of our minds. To do this we sometimes have to remove bad habits, just as we remove weeds in the garden; or we might have to stop wasting time on activities that are not productive.

We have now entered the season of Lent and during this period, we are called to look deep within the soil of our heart and to clear away that which is stopping us from growing in a Christ-like manner. It is also a time to take on good practices. Those could include taking more time in prayer, reading the Bible or other spiritual writings. These mindful activities prepare the soil of our heart and mind for the Light of Christ to bring forth new life within us come Easter Day.

The aim of all Christians is to have the mind of Christ, so that we can carry on His teachings and healing within the world. The path of discipleship, as Jesus tells us, is not an easy path. Many of us know the path but walking it is a different matter. So, over these next few weeks let us all be more diligent in our reading and the time we allow for prayers. Let us examine ourselves to make sure that on the day of resurrection we too experience this new life inside each and every one of us and bear good fruit. If you haven't yet joined one of our Lent groups, in which we shall be looking at our own discipleship, and would like to, it's not too late. Please just speak to me to let me know.

May Our Lord continue to bless you, and may the light always shine in your heart.

## Joe Pyke, RIP

Joe Pyke was born on 18 January 1928 to Elsie and Colin Pyke at his grandmother's pub in Hampshire; following in a long line of publicans, they moved to Tilehurst and

later his parents bought The George pub, beautifully situated at Lodden Bridge on the river Lodden. Joe was an only child and attained a scholarship to Reading Bluecoat School; he excelled at many sports including cricket, football and rugby. Golf became his passion in later life and he eventually became captain of Kettering Road Golf Club in 1972.

In 1946, he served his national service in the Royal Navy as a signaller on a minesweeper and it was during his national service that he shrugged off his real name, "Godfrey", for "Joe", by which he was called for the rest of his life. Once demobbed, he went to work for the General British Insurance Company, where, one fortuitous day he met a young secretary in the office, who he went on to marry. It was the insurance industry that he



worked in all his life; it brought them firstly to Northampton, and eventually to Blisworth, moving in to 38 High Street in 1963 where Win and Joe raised their family with much love and dedication. Joe often said how lucky he was to have such a lovely family.

Joe loved his church life and made many friends across the benefice. He and Win were married for 68 happy years. He died peacefully in hospital following a stroke with his family at his side. We will miss him.

Now begins the last journey, to reach the £8,000 needed to build Sir William /Payn a new tomb chest and, we hope, relocate him to the chancel off St Margaret's Church.
