Thursday 2 June - Let's Fill the Church with Flowers. 10.00 a m - 4.00 p m - St. Mary the Virgin

Shutlanger Parish Council

We started our meeting on 19 May with the annual village meeting, which sadly this year was not attended by any members of the public. The chair gave her report on the parish council's business for the year gone. We then moved onto the parish council meeting itself. This was a brief meeting with relatively little business to discuss. We reappointed the chair, vice chair and internal verifier to the parish council along with our internal auditor, NCALC. We also adopted updated versions of our risk assessment policy and standing orders as well as reviewing our insurance policy and our annual accountability statements.

As with everyone else, we are expecting a very large increase in the costs of running the village street lights (this has since been confirmed at a 127% increase). Members of the public have raised issues with the state of the village footpaths and the parish clerk will report these to Highways. The parish council decided to adopt as official business the open gardens event on 22 May and the Jubilee commemoration on 4 June.

For the remainder of this year, we will meet on 14 July 2022 and then 8 September 2022 and 10 November 2022. For 2023, the parish council has decided to meet on a new slot every other month, the third Tuesday, starting on12 January 2023 and then 9 March 2023.

Ukrainian Visitors

A family in Grafton Regis has successfully welcomed a family of four refugees from Ukraine. Already a son is in college and a daughter at a local school. All are working very hard to learn English, and to like British food and beer!

They expect to make England their forever home as they find this country and the people very welcoming. Conditions in their own country are dire and it will take many years to rebuild schools, hospitals etc. Equally, the parents fear for their children's safety in Ukraine. There are several other Ukrainian families arriving in our area and they are building a friendship community to help each other.

Grafton Regis: 1,000 Years in 1,000 Minutes



Our first historical walk of 2022 took place in glorious sunshine on Saturday 14 May. The number of visitors was restricted post-pandemic, so 33 people assembled in the village hall to meet the Abbot of Grestain, the village's former Norman owner, members of the Woodville family, and King Richard III.

En route to the church, Elizabeth Woodville's grandson, Henry VIII, and greatgranddaughter, Elizabeth I, addressed their subjects, and Henry's final meeting with Cardinal Thomas Wolsey was re-enacted. In the church, Lady Crane, last tenant of the original Grafton House, told the dramatic story of the final destruction of the house during the Civil War, and the history of the Grafton portrait of Shakespeare was recounted.

During the walk back to the hall, our visitors met Isabella Sams, daughter of the Victorian Rector of Grafton. Ada Brafield talked about her experience as schoolmistress, and finally tea and cakes were served.
