The Blisworth and Hunsbury Community Choir will be performing in St Mary the Virgin Church on Friday 22


July starting at 7.00 p m. Entry is free, but it is hoped that the audience will give generously to a charity of the choir's choice.

Coffee Morning






GENERAL NEWS An Update from Rt Hon. Dame Andrea Leadsom, MP

I feel very fortunate to represent such a beautiful area as South Northants, and I try to visit the 92 villages and parishes as often as parliamentary duties allow. With my team I hold regular village action days when we walk around one or two villages knocking on doors and speaking with residents about local and national issues. I am looking forward to visiting Blisworth soon, but in the meantime, if you have an issue that you would like my help with then please do not hesitate to get in touch.

A number of residents have been in touch about disruption caused by the installation plans of Gigaclear. Several constituents have emailed about the significant delays they have faced, with an extra 25 minutes added to the school run every day. I have raised the issue with WNC of insufficient notice given to residents, and also the importance of coordinating different road closures when works are taking place. Do let me know if you have any ongoing

I have been representing the interests of residents for several years now with regards to the Strategic Rail Freight Interchange at J15 of the A508. The latest delay is that National Rail are saying they cannot provide a rail link to



I recently visited the Canal & River Trust at the redesigned museum and café at Stoke Bruerne. 

Windows 10 warning



If these updates are interrupted, it can leave the

computer unable to start. Instead, a screen is presented which offers some suggestions of how to resolve the problem. Do not select 'Reset this PC', unless you know exactly what you are doing; at best, it will keep your data but erase all your programs, and at worst it will remove everything. Instead, choose 'Advanced Options' and then 'Start-up Repair'. If you are lucky, it will your recover Windows installation.
