Letter from the Rector

Alleluia Christ is risen. He has risen indeed. Alleluia. These words are on the lips of every Christian worldwide on Easter Sunday as we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

During Eastertide we stand with Christians, who through the centuries have celebrated Christ's triumph over death when he took our sins upon himself to show how much He loves every one of us and the price that He would give for our salvation. It is a time of new beginnings when we put away our old lives and take up a new life in Christ. Easter reminds us of the importance of sharing the Good News that our Saviour lives and is at work in the world today. One of our tasks as Christians is to join him in proclaiming this message.

Some people like to tell me that Christianity is in decline, but I don't think this is true. It is just that those who have been baptised no longer proclaim their faith out loud or gather around Our Lord's table on a Sunday morning. The Church is a beacon of love and hope in a world that desperately needs it. The very presence of God among us, that has shaped the very fabric of this country of which we are so proud.

Just recently in the news, people have been talking about St George's Cross on the collar of the national football team's new kit, and the colour it should be, the very cross that our Lord was crucified upon; some people seemed to be more concerned about what the cross looks like than the price that was paid upon it for their salvation.

How can we encourage others who have been baptised but who haven't attended church regularly for a while to come to the Lord's table each Sunday? To read their Bible, say their prayers daily and proclaim the Good News in how they live their lives? The only way is through evangelisation, but we must continually evangelise ourselves before we can evangelise others. During Lent, our studies reflected on Mary Martha and Lazarus, and it was noted that people wanted to carry on studying after Easter to deepen their understanding of our Christian faith. The answer to this is that it is something we all need to be doing. There will be more information on this in the coming weeks.

On June 2 in St Mary the Virgin Church in Grafton Regis, we will be celebrating The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist. Within the reading from Luke that the visitation comes from, we can see two women talking about their faith in God, an example we can all follow with family and friends. We will be welcoming Bishop John who will be preaching; we are planning to sing most of the service, and we are looking for people from across the benefice to come together and be part of the choir. If singing is not for you, then please do come along and share in what will be a wonderful occasion. One good way to share our faith is to bring a friend with you. You can always tell them that you are taking them out for a bite to eat as there will be refreshments afterwards, and then let God do the rest and speak to their hearts.

Residents can sign up for an annual direct debit to save having to remember to renew every year. Residents who are unable to access the internet can subscribe to the service by phoning the council on 0300 126 7000.
