Thy Kingdom Come

Thy Kingdom Come is a global wave of prayer between Ascension and Pentecost which started in 2016 by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. It is a time to deepen our relationship with Jesus. Ascension Day is 9 May, and on this day, the Archdeacon of Oakham will start her pilgrimage around the south border of the diocese reaching Towcester Deanery on 16 May. Starting in Piddington, her pilgrimage will walk through Hartwell down to the canal along the top of Grafton and finishing in Wicken.

On this day, the Dean of Peterborough will join in for the day. During the day there will be time for prayer and meeting with people. At 5.00 p m, there will be a short service in St Nicholas' Church Potterspury where Bishop John will join us. Refreshments will follow the service. You are welcome to come and join the Archdeacon, Dean and Bishop for this occasion of sharing our faith.

On the third Thursday of the month, in St Anne's Shutlanger at 9.30 a m, there is an opportunity to join in with Celtic morning prayer followed by a coffee morning in the hall, which is enjoyed by many. Parish Council Meeting


A Parish Council meeting and AGM will take place on 21 May at 7.30 p m in the village hall.

St Mary the Virgin Church for Stoke Bruerne and Shutlanger



A Trip to Antactica

Many of you will know that my darling husband, Professor David Vaughan, died last year on 9 February. David was a world-renowned glaciologist and an expert on ice melt and sea level rise. He had spent much of his working life in the Antarctic. One of our retirement plans was for me to accompany him on an Antarctic cruise, me enjoying myself and him lecturing. Unfortunately, that never happened; I wasn't sure if I wanted to go without him but a unique opportunity arose for me to go with The Friends of the Scott Polar Research Institute on a trip to the west of the Antarctic peninsula, going far south to cross the Antarctic circle.

I was very apprehensive but I was with people who had known David well and they were very keen to support me in all ways. I had the most amazing time and it really helped to see the part of the world that had been his life and a good part of mine as well. Seeing your first iceberg is pretty amazing and it just



builds from there. The wildlife surrounds you and is plentiful: orcas, humpbacks, seals, penguins and many, many types of birds including albatross.

The highlight of my trip was going to Rothera Base, one of major bases belonging British Antarctic Survey. This is



where David would have spent much of his time before and after field trips. It took a lot of organising, as cruise ships are not usually allowed to stop near there. I am very grateful to all the people who pulled together to get me there. I was able to present to the camp leader a framed photo of David to go in the bar, looking out over the bay, next to a photo of sledge dogs and near a photo of Ernest Shackleton - I know he would have loved that.

The Antarctic is a truly amazing place. It is difficult to find the words in the English language to describe its beauty. But it is also a vulnerable place. The effects of climate change can already be seen there: the retreating glaciers, more lichen, which makes the ice green and pink, more rain and changes in the animal distribution. The more we get to know

about it through science, hopefully, the more we can protect this wonderful place.

This was a cathartic trip and it has helped me to piece together the jigsaw of David's early death and to see a path forward.




